

## Instructions for Patients After a Root Canal

This sheet is for patients who received root canal therapy today. Below find some general guidelines that will help to ensure a successful outcome.

- 1. Most times, root canals are completed in one appointment. If your root canal was not completed, it is recommended to schedule the next appointment within 10 days.
- 2. Your tooth has a temporary filling in it. Be gentle with it because your tooth is very brittle until a permanent filling or crown is placed. If possible, chew on the other side until the next appointment.
- 3. It is likely that the tooth will ache for a few days and will be especially sensitive to biting over the next few days. This should go away within a week of treatment. It is recommended to take ibuprofen (motrin or advil) to help with the pain and inflammation. If pain is not taken away with ibuprofen, you can **combine Ibuprofen and Tylenol** (acetaminophen). They are different medications and can be taken at the same time.
- 4. If an antibiotic was prescribed, it is important to <u>finish the antibiotic</u> <u>completely</u> even if pain and symptoms go away before the medication is finished.
- 5. If the root canal was done on a back tooth (premolar or molar), it is important to cover the tooth with a dental crown as soon as possible. This helps to prevent the tooth from fracturing. If a tooth fractures badly before a crown is placed, it may need to be extracted.
